PHE and Training Hub Updates

• The training hub introduced Skyler Lesser-Roy, the new Training Hub Coordinator, and reviewed upcoming training opportunities. The shared services staff will work together to respond to any social services referrals or resource needs that arise during Kendra's maternity leave. Kendra created a list of local resources in Box that anyone can reference. An offer was extended for the second Regional Sanitarian position.

Epidemiology Updates

• Laura and Steven were unavailable to attend the meeting but recorded a video presenting on infectious disease trends, including measles, avian flu, and arbovirus.

Workplan and Budget Updates

Kendra reviewed the employee satisfaction survey results. Caitlyn led a discussion about CLAS standards. One
activity the group can work on is increasing public awareness that interpreter services are available through
signage. These could be available at health departments and vaccine clinics and include a list of common
languages for individuals to indicate as needed. Additionally, the group can work to increase staff members'
comfort and confidence with using interpreter services over the phone. Another idea is to take an inventory of
the language needs in each community and identify any existing capacity among staff.

Opioid Settlement Funds

• Judith held key informant interviews at Recovery Centers of America in Danvers. Participants brought up the issue around the lack of halfway homes and sober homes in Danvers. They also noted that there are veterans who are having trouble accessing veterans' services, and not all caseworkers were aware that this is an available resource. Judith connected the Danvers Veterans' Services Director with RCA. Judith also talked to an organization called Sober Sistahs that highlighted the lack of community events for people in recovery. They said they would like to connect with others going through similar lived experiences, particularly with in-person events that don't include alcohol.
